KEY COUNCIL MEETING DECISIONS

AT ITS AUGUST MEETING, COUNCIL:

- Endorsed the Cradle Coast Waste Management Group Annual Plan and Budget 2009/10
- Repealed the Water Supply Policy adopted by Council on 16 November 2006
- Repealed the Water Connections Outside a Water District Policy
- Noted the summary results of an audit of dairy effluent systems undertaken in the first half of 2009 and agreed to seek funding opportunities from external sources to assist in the monitoring and administration of dairy effluent management in Circular Head.
- Approved safety and maintenance expenditure not exceeding the 2009/10 boat ramp budget allocation to the Montagu Park public boat ramp.
