CAPITAL WORKS IN PROGRESS

Smith Street, Smithton – works are now 50% complete with the following programmed for the next 6 weeks:

- Complete construction of gravel road pavement
- Lay new pavers in footpaths
- Construct garden beds
- Lay new asphalt seal – scheduled for late April

Drivers please note that because of the road works the traffic lights are controlled by timers, which means they won't change as frequently as they normally would.

Until the new asphalt seal is laid the gravel surface may change frequently, please keep your speed down or avoid driving through the site if possible. Pedestrians are asked to take extreme care when walking along the footpath, particularly with the increased activity due to the laying of pavers.

GENERAL WORKS

Stanley power line works – From Monday 12 April trench digging will commence in a small section of Alexander Terrace and Church Street, Stanley so that power lines can be placed underground. Drivers are advised that there will be short traffic delays while the works are carried out.
