National Australia Day Conference

Healthy Communities Initiative

The Circular Head Healthy Communities Initiative Session Two concluded on 23 May 2011 with seven participants completing the program. The Cradle Coast Authority has been consulting with staff regarding the program development, with the intention of offering the program to other Councils within the Cradle Coast Region.

Council will receive funding for a further two years to implement health and well-being programs as part of the extension phase of the Cradle Coast Authority Healthy Communities Initiative.

Kilos for the Community Support Groups are held at the Circular Head Council every fortnight at 5:30pm Wednesday and 10:00am Thursday. The support group links to the balance your life health and well being initiative, giving ongoing support to our community.

Category Winner - National Award for Local Government - Seven Up Youth Centre

Circular Head Council is one of 17 winners (across 10 categories) to be judged a winner in the Youth engagement (small Council) category of the National Awards for Local Government. The award was for the process undertaken to develop the Seven Up Youth Centre in Smithton. Two Council staff flew to Canberra to present the project to a panel of judges, with the aim of becoming an overall national winner. The presentation ceremony for all category winners and the announcement of the overall national winner will take place at the 2011 National Assembly of Local Government 19-22 June. The Mayor and Project Officer will attend. The award recognises some of the innovative ways that councils are approaching the issues facing local government and demonstrates the way our Community Services Department strive to achieve best practice in the area of community engagement.

Circular Head Youth Leaders

Out in the Cold 'Community and Business Leaders sleeping rough for a night' will be on the night of 23 June 2011 from 7pm-6am on Emmett Street, Smithton. Circular Head Youth Leaders are trying to raise awareness of homelessness in our community. All money raised goes directly towards the ongoing provision of Vinnies' in Circular Head.

Winter Woollies Campaign has seen bags of warm winter woollies enter the

doors of Council and Woolworth over the last few days. The Campaign will come to an end on the 28 June 2011.

"The Future is in your Cup" Coffee Stall is an initiative of the Circular Head Youth Leaders. CHYL are currently looking for members to volunteer to be part of The Future is in your Cup Coffee Stall for this year and next. The members will have the opportunity to receive qualified barista training and customer service which they will then be able to place on their resume for future employment. Once everyone has undertaken the training and before starting off at their first event they will be given the time to improve their skills at a range of different venues such as Council, Schools, Seven Up Youth Centre and private businesses. Some of the events "The Future is in your Cup" Coffee Stall will attend include Australia Day, Christmas Parade, National Youth Week, Football grand finals and much more.

Bang Crash Tap

Council will be holding a performance from the Raw Dance Company, Bang! Crash! Tap! Both the Smithton High School and the Circular Head Christian School have confirmed their attendance. It will be held on 21 July 2011 at the Circular Head Christian School, with a combined BBQ to commence the event.

Bang! Crash! Tap! has also been booked to perform at the Stanley Town Hall on 21 July 2011 at 7.30 pm for the wider community to attend.

Trails and Bikeways Grant

Council has received a grant for \$15,000 through the Sport and Recreation Trails and Bikeways Grants Program to erect directional signage and seal a section of the Tatlovs Beach Walk that connects the newly completed trail at Stanley.

West Esplanade Playground

The playground project at West Esplanade is nearing completion. Play equipment and soft-fall has been installed.

Exercise Equipment - East Duck River Foreshore Trail

Following the completion of the Lose Kilos for the Community Program Council staff in consultation with a representative from Island Recreation has selected four sites for exercise equipment to be installed along the walking track. Eleven pieces of equipment and soft-fall have been ordered. Installation time will be subject to warm weather conditions required to lay the soft-fall successfully.

Leisure and Recreation Master Plan

Consultant Ken Marriott (HM Leisure Planning P/L) and partners last week held community consultation sessions and interviews with key stakeholders in relation to the preparation of a Leisure and Recreation Master Plan for the Circular Head area.
