Council Asks Residents to Tell It Where To Go - Community Survey

Circular Head Council is asking residents to tell it where to go. While somewhat tongue in cheek, Council encourages as many people as possible to take part in a survey to give the best understanding of what services the community values.

Circular Head Mayor Daryl Quilliam said Council wanted to hear from a wide section of the community.

“This is the third time we have run this survey and it really is the best opportunity for our residents to tell us how we are performing and how they feel about living in Circular Head,” Mayor Quilliam said.

“In previous surveys the community has prioritised a number of areas, so we need to check in with them and see how we are going and what they think we need to do in the future.”

Mayor Quilliam said the survey would also cover a number of other areas such as how people like to interact with Council.

“We want to know what the community thinks we are doing well, but also importantly where we need to improve,” Mayor Quilliam said.

“The survey will give us a clear understanding of the community’s expectations and whether they believe our services and facilities are up to scratch.”

Circular Head Australian Day Citizens of the year Brianna Hite, Jenny Poke and Eric Marshall are ready to provide their feedback and have encouraged others to do the same.

They all said that taking part in the survey is a great way to tell Council where to go.

Whether people answer all questions in the survey or not is up to them, but Mayor Quilliam said all responses would be considered.

“Importantly the outcomes from the survey will be published when it’s finished, which ensures we are being open about what the community is telling us,” Mayor Quilliam said.

“The survey is being handled by an independent survey company, which also means all feedback is anonymous.”
