Julius River Vandalism – a disgraceful act

Circular Head Council received a report from Parks and Wildlife Service about recent vandalism at the Julius River Reserve on the Tarkine Drive.

Mayor Daryl Quilliam says “Council was disgusted to hear of the deliberate destruction of reserve infrastructure.” It is understood an axe has been used to cause the damage.

“People who would go out of their way to destroy public facilities should take a long hard look at themselves” says Mayor Quilliam.

Julius River Reserve forms part of the Tarkine Drive experience and was recently refurbished. Damage to the picnic area and BBQ facilities means it will be out of action to the public until it can be repaired.

“This action harms the whole community as our taxes will go into the repairs instead of other areas.” says Mayor Quilliam. “as with any vandalism I encourage people to report this type of behaviour to the Police”
