## COUNCIL MEETING

### AT ITS SEPTEMBER MEETING, COUNCIL:

- Acting as a Planning Authority, resolved to make a supplementary submission to the Tasmanian Planning Commission in regard to Clauses 26.3.2 and 26.3.3 (Rural Resource Zone) so that the permit application process for a residential use provides greater opportunity and certainty;
- Acting as a Planning Authority, approved an application for a dwelling and shed on land zoned Rural Resource, at RA 611 Irishtown Road, Irishtown;
- Acting as a Planning Authority, approved an application for an extension to café/restaurant and additional fish storage tank at 2 Alexander Terrace, Stanley;
- Approved a new Development Service Fee for dispensation and rezoning with dispensation fees;
- Adopted the Asset Management Policy;
- Adopted the Area Management Committee Instrument of Appointment, Delegations and Operational Procedures
- Noted the minutes of the Central Outdoor Area Management Committee, the Circular Head Education and Training Consultative Committee, the Community Road Safety Partnership Committee, the Circular Head Municipal Emergency Management Committee, the Northern Area Management Committee, the Stanley Town Hall Committee and the Western Area Management Committee.

#### Science Big Gig

The 2014 Science Big Gig was held on Monday 18 August at the Circular Head Community and Recreation Centre. The theme of this year's event was 'Feed the World' and focused on the importance of family farming in an age of corporate food production. The event was once again well supported by schools, industry and the community.

#### Opportunities and Options Expo

CHETCC partnered with the Circular Head Progress Group to deliver the Circular Head Opportunities and Options Expo at the Circular Head Community and Recreation Centre on Thursday 11 September 2014. The event was officially opened by Brett Whiteley MP and saw over 30

exhibitors representing a range of industries and services delivering information to participants from schools and the community on the day. The event received positive feedback from participants and exhibitors, although attendance by the wider community was disappointing. Ryan Shearman from Smithton High School won the lucky door prize, an iPad donated by Circular Head Council through its CHETCC committee.

#### Heywire grant

A working group has been established with members of Council, CHAC and Rural Health to commence the documentary project. Producer Bronwyn Purvis has been secured for the documentary. Meetings will be held with local police, paramedics, doctors, nurses and SES to discuss their possible involvement in the project. Significant media commitments are being undertaken as part of the grant conditions.

#### Youth survey

A survey of Smithton High and Circular Head Christian School youth leaders has been taken to gauge interest in various activities. Questions revolved around the students' interest in school holiday and after school activities, what issues are facing them and what they would like from Council. Results are currently being collated.

#### CHYL 1 in 4

CHYL members are currently involved in a mental health campaign named "1 in 4". As part of this campaign members attended a 1 day mental health training workshop and have been involved in a media/social media campaign to raise awareness about mental health for 16-24 year olds.

Members of the community services team also attended a two-day mental health first aid certificate course.
