Rate Resolution for 2021/22

Council will be considering the rates for the 2021/22 financial year at the June 2021 meeting, ahead of adopting its annual plan and budget estimates.

A General rate increase of 4.80% has been proposed following a zero movement in the 2020/21 year.

The Community has faced a turbulent 18 months and to enable Council to continue providing essential services at current levels it is prudent to keep up with inflation (4.5% over the same period). The General rate increase will continue to support services such as tourism, youth and community events, recreation facilities and a vast network of roads and bridges.

Circular Head Mayor Daryl Quilliam says "Council is committed to reviewing its operating activities to ensure they provide a value for money benefit for the community".

Council will continue to support ticket free entry to the White Hills waste disposal site, as well as keeping wheelie bin collection costs the same as last year.
