Students from the University of Tasmania's Rural Clinical School will be conducting medical training exercises in the municipality on Thursday, 15 March. The exercises form part of an Emergency Skills course which immerses medical students in realistic remote scenarios where they are challenged to assess, diagnose and treat a number of casualties. The simulated activities will result in a large visual presence of emergency services personnel at Julius River Forest Reserve between 10am – 1pm, and the Riverbend Youth Centre on Trowutta Road, Scotchtown around 5pm.
