## Wheelie Bin Sticker Replacement

A recent wheelie bin collection audit by Circular Head Council has confirmed that Council are collecting several hundred unauthorised wheelie bins each fortnight.

Property owners pay for the cost of the wheelie bin collection service as a component of their rates payment and some choose to have more than one service, which incurs an additional fee.

Circular Head Mayor, Daryl Quilliam said "Council is committed to delivering responsible financial efficiencies to our ratepayers and the collection of unauthorised wheelie bins increases costs to those that legitimately pay for the service. This is unfair and cannot continue."

Authorised wheelie bins are identified by a Council issued sticker and Council has made the decision to replace all of the existing wheelie bin stickers with a newly designed sticker.

The new stickers will be provided to paying customers and should be attached to the wheelie bin by 1 November to ensure continued collection of authorised bins. Bins without the new sticker will no longer be collected from that date.

Landlords are asked to either issue their tenants with the new sticker or replace the sticker on the bin themselves.
